



CHECKLIST : OPENING DAY

- Everything packed and labeled with names
- BRING Health History Form completed by parent/guardian and physician (everything legible!)
- Be sure a copy of health insurance card - both sides - is attached to Health History Form
- Everything signed as needed (Health History Form) including doctor and parent signatures as noted.
- BRING completed "Camper Profile" to give to counselor

If you have medications from home:

- BRING medications in original containers, making certain prescription matches Health History Form notations. Make certain there is enough for your camper's entire stay!
- BRING two (2) of each inhaler/epipens if your child uses these.
- Give considerable consideration to getting a "summer haircut" (the less hair, the shorter the wait in the Health Center lines)

CAMP LOUISE

- As you drive up to camp, at the crest of the hill, before the front gate, look for a staff member to give you parking directions and luggage instructions - we will be able to deliver up to TWO (2) items to your camper's bunk - you are responsible for carrying additional items
- Walk up the hill to the White House with Health History Form and all medications and Camper Profile - a staff member will point you in the right direction

NO ONE FROM CAMPER'S FAMILY - OR CAMPER - SHOULD GO TO BUNK UNTIL ALL THE FOLLOWING STEPS HAVE BEEN TAKEN

- Go to the registration area in the White House with your Health History form (completed with copy of your insurance card attached)
- Find your line (alphabetical by last name)
- You'll be asked to set up a bank account for your camper - cash or checks only (checks payable to Camp Louise) will be accepted
- You'll be given your bunk number - WRITE IT DOWN!!!
- Let us know if your camper has a birthday while up at camp - you can arrange to purchase a cake. Look for the sign
- If you are going to be away while your daughter is at camp, please complete at check-in a Parent Itinerary form
- Go to Outdoor Living table to check "permission forms"
- Go to Music table to sign up for music lessons (optional)
- Go to the Health Center "check in" table in the White House
- Go to Health Center when called - be sure to take Health History form and any medications you may have
- If you like, check out LouiseWear table at Tillie's Corner
- Go to bunk ONLY AFTER YOUR CAMPER HAS HAD FULL SCREENING!
- Introduce yourself and camper to counselors
- Find pre-assigned bed - there will be notes on bed, be sure to take them with you
- Help your camper unpack (make certain she helps and sees where everything is placed)
- Give "Camper Profile" to counselors
- Return to your vehicle in a timely manner as parking is limited

- Write lots of letters
- Don't forget the ending date of your session (campers can't be mailed home!!)

CAMP AIRY

- As you drive into camp, stop to see staff member and get "parking location number"
- Head up the hill - a staff member will point you in the right direction
- If you are told: #1 - park in Bunk Row area; #2 parking lot area - a staff member will help unload your vehicle

NO ONE FROM CAMPER'S FAMILY - OR CAMPER - SHOULD GO TO BUNK UNTIL ALL THE FOLLOWING STEPS HAVE BEEN TAKEN

- Once parked, go to the registration porch with your completed Health History Form (with copy of insurance card attached)
- Find the line for your last name
- You'll be asked to set up a bank account for your camper - cash or checks only (checks payable to Camp Airy) will be accepted
- You'll be given your bunk number - WRITE IT DOWN!!!
- Let us know if your camper has a birthday while up at camp - you can arrange to purchase a cake here
- If you are going to be away while your son is at camp, please complete at check-in a Parent Itinerary form
- Go to Outdoor Living table to check "permission form"
- Go to Music table to sign up for music lessons (optional)
- If you like, check out the AiryWear table (shirts, sweats, shorts, caps...)
- Go to Health Center - be sure to take Health History Form and any medications you may have:
